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Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball

Operating since 1997, the Crystal Lake Bombers mission of player development is unique among travel baseball clubs and teams. The model for high school and college team organization and operation is directly applied. This means we entrust coaching duties to a paid staff of baseball instructors, qualified to teach and train our teams without partisanship. The primary role for parents is booster, providing support and encouragement for the team. Because we eliminate the usual nepotism associated with travel teams, players thrive in a competitive baseball environment that is a realistic prelude to their high school and collegiate experience.

Mission Statement

Travel baseball teams are formed to accelerate player development. The vision of a competitive baseball program is to help athletes prepare for success at a level of play beyond their current experience. Youth teams aim to prepare players to compete at the high school level; varsity or senior teams prepare players to play at the collegiate level.

Our baseball program is rooted in education. Knowing, understanding, and performing fundamental skills are the foundation for playing excellence. To elevate a player's skill, knowledge and understanding must be increased and conditioned by the third component, regular opportunities to perform.

Becoming a winner is part of the process of player development. Winning is more than the score of a game; it is the way to play the game. Learning to become a winner requires belief, preparation, discipline, confidence, diligence, perseverance, respect and support for others. These values are emphasized throughout Bombers' training and participation.

Parents are boosters. Compared to most youth baseball travel teams, this general principle sets our program apart. All parents have equal status as club members. Coaching duties above U13 are entrusted to a paid staff (ASEP certified), and the coaches make decisions independently, in accord with the club's primary goals for player development. Just like the high school teams for whom our Bombers will eventually play, our parents' role is providing support and encouragement for the team. When this principle is applied, our players enjoy a positive atmosphere, enhancing their Bombers' experience.

During their time as players for the Crystal Lake Bombers Organization, our young men have tremendous opportunities to excel at the game of baseball as well as continue in their ongoing development of becoming upstanding adults in the future. The Crystal Lake Bombers Organization believes that by giving our time back to the community in various ways, these young men learn to be more confident, courageous and build their characters in a positive way. The Crystal Lake Bombers organization is only as strong as the people involved. While the duties of coaching are handled by professionally trained and certified coaches, there are many opportunities for the parents of our players to be involved in our organization. Each team will be responsible for obtaining parent volunteers to fill the Team Administrator and Committee positions that are required for each team to operate.

These positions must be filled by the close of the Parent Orientation meeting.

Team Administrators:

- ❖ Team Manager
 - Primary team spokesperson; will be the main source of team communications and point person between the team and the Bombers board at monthly board meetings.
 - Assist with team travel responsibilities
 - Team representative at travel league meetings
 - Assists head coach in planning schedule and tournaments.
 - Registers team in tournaments; provides appropriate documents to fulfill participation requirements.
 - Brings to all events (practices and games) Emergency Contact Forms and team's medical/safety kit. Completes and submits Injury/Accident reports as required.
 - Responsible for equipment issued to the team by the Bombers
 - Coordinate orders for tournament shirts, pins, etc. and collect payments for these items
 - Brings Team Banner to all league games and tournaments.
 - Responsible for Team Binder
- ❖ Team Treasurer
 - Responsible for tracking finances and coordinating team payments.
 - Collect player dues and forwards payments to organization
 - Communicate team check needs to board Treasurer
 - Umpire payments for 14U and below
 - Attending board meetings to review financials with the board treasurer
 - Communicate with board team payment status and any payment issues
- ❖ Website Administrator (*12u & 13u maintain both MCBL and clbombers.com sites*)
 - Posts team's game and practice schedules including updating any schedule changes.
 - Posts team news, player profiles, photos and team announcements on the website.
 - Updates website with any team specific information.
 - Update and maintain Sponsorship listings on website
- ❖ Photographer
 - Regularly take photos of the team during games and tournaments.
 - Make photos available to families on a website such as smugmug.com.
 - Forward team photos to website administrator for inclusion on the website.
- ❖ Score Keeper/Stats
 - Keeps score at all league games and tournaments.
 - Provides stats to head coach.
 - Individual teams will decide on what application to keep score/stats
- ❖ Coaches/Team Field Maintenance
 - Schedules and coordinates fall and spring workday duties and assignments at home field.
 - Arranges proper storage of field maintenance supplies and equipment issued for team's use.
 - Coordinates work crews to perform field prep before and after games and practices.
 - Inspects field after games; checks that all equipment is safely stored and secure.

Team committee representatives and other volunteer opportunities:

- ❖ **Sponsorship Committee** - A team of representatives that will work with the Manager of Sponsorship to obtain local business and individual sponsorships and other donations as well as work on the Team Banner. We need a team of parents from each age to help with this process. They would meet and present items to the board at each board meeting through Feb 2021 board meeting.
- ❖ **Goodwill Committee** - A team of representatives that will work with the Director of Goodwill to organize the team's community service projects. This team will meet monthly at the board meetings to discuss agendas and service projects.
- ❖ **Organization Events Committee** - A team of representatives that will work with the Director of Goodwill on organization events like the fall bowling event, season kickoff party in the spring, end of season party and possibly other team bonding events (a Cougars game). This team will meet monthly at board meetings to plan and present these events.
- ❖ **Spirit-wear Committee** - A team representative that will work with the VP on Bomber-wear for the 2021 season. Meetings at the board meetings to order and deliver to team managers all the items needed to fulfill multiple orders for startup, Christmas, and in season items.
- ❖ **Academic Committee** – A team of representatives will work to gather all academic achievements as well as “Where are they now” information to report to website designer to update website.

Player fees are to be turned into the Treasurer ***no later than the 15th of every month***. Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball will not send out bills or reminders to members, or relentlessly chase down those who are not in compliance with the payment schedule. It is our expectation that all fees will be paid on time and in accordance with this schedule. Failure to meet the scheduled obligation will result in a player not being able to participate in games, practices and all team activities.

- ❖ Any player not current on their fees at any point forfeit their use of PCA and will not be allowed to participate in team functions.
- ❖ Any player whose fees are not current as of February 1, 2021 will not receive any portion of their uniform.
- ❖ After March 1, 2021, any fees that are 30 days past due will result in suspension of the player from all team practices, workouts, games and tournaments.

No refunds of player fees will be made including instances of voluntary or involuntary release from the team or injury. The commitment to pay all fees is binding.

Payment Methods

Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball will accept the following forms of payment: personal checks, certified bank checks, Money Orders or Credit Card payments (subject to a transaction fee). No cash payments will be accepted for player fees. Checks should be made payable to **CLBBI**. If check is returned due to insufficient funds, the player's family will be responsible for all related fees incurred by Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball, and from that point onward the only forms of accepted payment will be certified check or money order.

Being part of a travel baseball organization involves a high level of commitment by both the player and their parents. Teams often begin practicing and playing fall ball as early as September, moving straight into winter workouts in November, and tournaments can begin in March which could involve practices or tournaments during your child's spring break. Providing conflict information will be helpful to your coaches in scheduling practices, league play and tournaments. Understand that if your child is consistently absent from practices or is vacationing during tournaments, your child's coaches can choose to sit your child (1) game for every missed game or practice. List any possible conflicts that your child may have over the course of the 2020-2021 season.

Include participation in other sports - games and practices, school functions including graduations, religious education classes, previously scheduled out of town dates, etc. Also include the dates that your child's school has winter break, spring break, and the scheduled last day of school.

Player's Code of Conduct and Travel Player Commitment

Players will:

- Not use unsportsmanlike gestures, talk, language, or profanity. Players will not taunt or tease players on the opposing team.
- Show respect towards the Umpire(s) and their decisions. All decisions made by the umpires are to be accepted as final. No player will argue a call or judgment. Only the Manager and Coach will question calls and judgments.
- Not throw his bat, helmet, glove or any object in disgust on or off the playing field at any time.
Accept the coaches' decision regarding playing positions and the amount of playing time. It is understood that this is a Travel Team and there are no guarantees for equal playing time or position.
- Be on time to and attend every practice and game. Players will notify their coach if they cannot attend or will be late.
- Give the coaches their full attention and focus so they are able to listen and learn from their coaches.
- Understand that Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball, Inc. (CLBBI) reserves the right to release any player from the team for poor sportsmanship by the player and/or the player's family during games or for other reasons to include but are not limited to lack of cooperation, poor attitude, lack of commitment, lack of effort, or attendance.
- Follow the guidelines set forth for the team and the program.
- Understand that if a player is dismissed from a practice and/or a game the coach has the discretion to suspend the player.
- Understand that the coach may impose additional rules, guidelines and/or policies that they are required to follow and failure to comply with the rules, guidelines and/or policies is a violation of commitment.
- Understand that CLBBI teams play the game with professionalism and class. As a result, we show class by how we dress. Hats will be worn properly (forward and straight), clothing will be tucked in and worn like a baseball player.
- Understand that CLBBI players are expected to be model baseball players. Play the game right and leave the field making others impressed with how CLBBI players play the game.
- Understand that as a CLBBI player, actions off the baseball field will reflect the entire CLBBI program.
- Be a positive representative of our community and make the community proud of their actions as a baseball player and a person. Each Bombers player is strongly encouraged to participate in CLBBI organized community service opportunities offered each season.
- Remain committed to CLBBI for the duration of the team's season. Players are not allowed on another team's roster without written consent of the primary CLBBI coach.
- Encourage their parents to be involved with their team in some capacity because it is important to them.
- Do their best in school.
- Understand that they have the right to play in an environment that is free of drugs, tobacco, and alcohol and expect adults to refrain from their use at all sports events.
- As a Crystal Lake Bomber, I will not play, practice or compete with another organization until the completion of all games including tournaments with my current Bomber team.

Parents' Code of Conduct and Parent/Guardian Commitment

Parents will:

- Obey all rules and regulations of Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball, Inc. (CLBBI) and the various Travel Leagues and organizations of which CLBBI participates.
- Honor the financial commitment required by CLBBI in a timely manner.
- Get their players to practice and games on time.
- Remember that children play baseball for their enjoyment, not their parents.
- Not publicly question an Umpire's judgment and never their honesty. Accept the Umpire's decision as final.
- Set a good example by treating the managers, coaches, other players, officials and spectators with respect.
- Accept the coaches' decision regarding playing positions and the amount of playing time and also understand that this is a Travel Team and there are no guarantees for equal playing time or position.
- Understand that CLBBI reserves the right to release any player from the team for poor sportsmanship by the player and/or the player's family during games or for other reasons to include but are not limited to lack of cooperation, poor attitude, lack of commitment, lack of effort, or poor attendance.
- Refrain from giving players instructions during the game – allow the coaches to manage the team and game.
- Not enter the dugout or other team specific areas unless asked by the coaching staff.
- Understand that coaches may impose additional rules, guidelines and/or policies that I am required to follow and failure to comply with the rules, guidelines and/or policies is a violation of your commitment.
- Not ridicule or yell at any player, including their own for any reason.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from youth sporting activities.
- Understand that if there is a problem/conflict with the Manager or Coaches, parents will not approach them during or after a game. Instead they will call the coach to discuss the matter or set a meeting to discuss the matter. If the problem cannot be resolved a meeting with the Board of Directors can be requested.
- Understand and acknowledge that the base player registration payment is non-refundable. If a player is dismissed or voluntarily leaves CLBBI the parents are not entitled to a refund and all monies are forfeited.
- Understand that players have the right to play in an environment that is free from drugs, tobacco, tobacco related products and alcohol; their parents are expected to respect this right during youth sports events and refrain from use within the baseball venue.

Parental Waiver, Release of Liability, Indemnification and Consent Form

I, the undersigned, as the parent or legal guardian of the child named below, do hereby give my full consent and approval for my child to participate as a member of the CRYSTAL LAKE BOMBERS BASEBALL CLUB and the CRYSTAL LAKE BOMBERS BASEBALL, INC. TRAVEL TEAM designated below.

I understand that there are certain risks of damages and injuries, including sickness, permanent disability, paralysis and death, inherent in the practice and play of baseball, as well as in traveling and in other related activities incidental to my child's participation, and I am willing to assume these risks on behalf of my child. These risks include, but are not limited to, those hazards associated with weather conditions, travel, playing conditions, equipment, other participants, as well as being exposed to and/or infected with the Covid-19 disease, viral infections, bacterial infections and other communicable diseases and illnesses.

I understand that the very nature of the game of baseball is hazardous and risky, including, but not limited to, the acts of pitching the ball, having the ball hit back at the pitcher, fielding the ball, swinging the bat, running, jumping, stretching, sliding, diving and collisions with other players, coaches, volunteers and stationary objects, all of which can cause serious injury or death to my child and to other participants.

Further, I agree that in consideration for the right to allow my child to participate as a member of Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball and in consideration for permission to play on the fields arranged for by Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball, Inc. and the team of which I am a member:

1. On behalf of my child and myself, I do voluntarily elect to accept and solely assume all risks of injury incurred or suffered by my child (a) while practicing or playing as a member of the team so designated, (b) while serving in a non-playing capacity as a team member or observer during practice or play by other teams or by other players on my child's team, and (c) while on or upon the premises of any and all of the fields arranged for by the team or Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball, Inc. for practice or play.
2. In addition to giving my full consent for my child's participation, I do hereby waive, release, discharge and agree not to sue Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball, Inc. (their agents, servants, officers, directors, employees, members, and volunteers), the owner or operator of any field, or any person or entity connected with the team or field for any claim, damages, costs including attorney's fees, or cause of action which I or my child have or may have in the future as a result of damages, injuries, including death, sustained or incurred by my child from whatever cause including, but not limited to, the negligence, breach of contract or wrongful conduct of the parties hereby released.
3. I declare that I exercised my own judgment in deciding whether to sign this agreement and I further declare that my decision to sign was not based on or influenced by any declarations or representations of the Crystal Lake Bombers Baseball, Inc., or its employees, agents, or instructors. In addition, I agree that I will be responsible for payment for any and all medical services provided. This includes any and all medical costs and any and all transportation costs to and from any medical facility.
